

Joint Committee for Economic, Trade, Science and **Technology meet**

he 18th meeting of the Joint Committee for Economic, Trade, Science and Technology Cooperation was held in Hanoi in October 2023 while the 5th meeting of the Sub-Committee on Trade was held in New Delhi in August 2023.

The JCM meeting was co-chaired by Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs of India and Minister of Foreign Affairs of Vietnam. The 5th Meeting of Sub-Committee on Trade was co-chaired by Shri Rajesh Agrawal, Additional Secretary, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce & Industry from Indian side and Ms. Phan Thi Thang, Deputy Minister, Ministry of Industry and Trade from

Vietnam side. Both sides are discussing the review of ASEAN India Free Trade Agreement.

India and Vietnam has long standing trade and economic relations which have steadily grown over a period. From a meagre US\$200 million in the year 2000, according to Vietnamese figure, bilateral trade grew to US\$ 14.36 billion in 2023. According to Indian data during 2023-2024, bilateral trade reached US\$ 14.82 billion, registering an increase of 0.76 percent year on year. India exports to Vietnam reached US\$ 5.47 billion (down 7.43%) while Indian imports from Vietnam amounted to 9.34 billion (up 6.26%).

Both sides have established institutional mechanism regarding trade related matter which include Joint Committee for Economic, Trade, Science and Technology Cooperation (JCM), Sub-Committee on Trade, Joint Working Groups on Agriculture, Healthcare, ICT and S&T.

In FY 2023-2024, For India, Vietnam is the 21st largest trading partner and 22nd largest export destination globally. For Vietnam, India is the 7th largest trading partner, 7th biggest importer of Vietnam's products and 11th biggest import source of Vietnam.

Global Ayush Expo, January 2025



Exports have more than doubled, reaching \$2.16 billion, driven by increased global demand for traditional medicines. Homeopathy and Sowa Rigpa books and Pharmacopoeias added to amended Drugs and Cosmetics Act

The Ministry of AYUSH has amended the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, to include the French and European Homoeopathic Pharmacopoeias for the manufacturing and import of homoeopathic medicines. It has also added important books on Homoeopathy and Sowa Rigpa systems of medicine to the Act. These amendments aim to standardize and regulate these practices alongside existing traditional systems like Ayurveda, Siddha, and Unani. This move highlights the government's efforts to integrate various traditional medicinal knowledge systems into the legal framework.

New division created to facilitate coverage of insurance in Ayush sector

The National AYUSH Mission (NAM) in Kerala has created a new division to facilitate the inclusion of AYUSH sector institutions in insurance



networks. This initiative follows a meeting with experts from the Ministry of AYUSH and aims to link AYUSH facilities with cashless insurance options, enhancing accessibility. Kerala, known for its numerous AYUSH hospitals, is positioning itself to benefit from this move, with plans for public hospitals to join the insurance network. The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority (IRDAI) has mandated AYUSH treatment coverage starting April 2024.

NIN taps Ayurveda for menopause care

Interview

Dr. Sangeeta Duggal, Advisor (Homeopathy), Ministry of Ayush



Q) Can you provide an overview of the initiatives that the Ministry has taken to promote Homeopathy, nationally and on the global stage?

A) Ministry of Ayush has implemented various initiatives to strengthen and promote homeopathy in India and internationally. Nationally, programs such as the National AYUSH Mission focus on integrating Ayush including homeopathy, into mainstream healthcare and ensuring its accessibility to rural and underserved areas. Globally, the Ministry has signed MoUs with several countries to facilitate research, education, and the promotion of homeopathy. Participation in international forums like the World Health Organization (WHO) and the International Congresses on Homeopathy has also been instrumental in advocating for its global acceptance. Additionally, the Ministry organizes conferences, training programs, and trade fairs to showcase India's expertise in homeopathy.

Q) How is the Ministry working to enhance the scientific validation of homeopathic practices?

A) Scientific validation is a core priority. Central Council for Research in Homeopathy (CCRH) under Ministry of Ayush has undertaken various initiatives to promotes evidence-based research by conducting clinical trials and other research studies. Initiatives like developing standard treatment guidelines and funding research projects in collaboration with academic institutions are aimed at generating robust scientific data. Additionally, Ministry provides grants under Extramural Research (EMR) scheme to the other organisations to facilitate research.

Pharmacopoeia Commission for Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy (PCIM&H), a sub-ordinate office under Ministry of Ayush, develops official guidelines and quality standards for Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, and Homoeopathy (ASU&H) medicines. These standards help ensure the identity, purity, and strength of ASU&H drugs, as required by the Drugs & Cosmetics Act, 1940, and rules thereunder. These standards are mandatory for manufacturing Ayush medicines in India. By implementing these quality guidelines, the government ensures that the medicines available to the public meet high-quality standards.

and ensuring quality control and standardization of medicines. Addressing workforce shortages and improving technical training are also critical to sustaining growth.

An Ayush vertical in Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) has also been established to further strengthen the regulatory framework of Ayush drugs across the country.

The Ministry of Ayush is actively working to address such challenges. Efforts include promoting evidence-based research in homeopathy, simplifying regulatory provisions and establishing robust quality assurance mechanisms. Furthermore, initiatives are being undertaken to enhance workforce capacity by conducting training programs and encouraging collaborations with academic institutions and industry stakeholders.

Q) Are there any specific international partnerships or collaborations that have significantly impacted trade within the homeopathy sector?

A) Yes, collaborations with countries like UK, Israel, and Latin American nations have significantly bolstered trade and research in Ayush systems. Agreements with WHO have helped standardize homeopathy and Ayush globally, creating new opportunities for Indian manufacturers. Additionally, participation in forums like BRICS, G20, SCO and ASEAN have boosted new markets for homeopathic products.

Q) With an increasing trade volume, how is sustainability of raw materials for homeopathy products being addressed?

A) Ministry has taken several steps to ensure the sustainability of raw materials. Initiatives include promoting the cultivation of medicinal plants used in homeopathy under the National Medicinal Plants Board (NMPB) and encouraging good agricultural practices. Collaborations with states and farmers to establish medicinal plant clusters and eco-friendly harvesting techniques are also in place. Efforts to identify and develop alternative sources of key raw materials are ongoing to reduce pressure on natural resources. In addition, creating the homeopathic vertical in Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) has opened new avenue in focusing standards of homeopathic drugs, services, and terminologies.

brought homeopathy closer to remote areas, while advancements in AI and data analytics are being utilized to analyse patient outcomes and optimize treatment protocols. Furthermore, e-pharmacies and digital marketing have expanded the reach of homeopathy products both nationally and globally. Ministry of Ayush has launched several digital health initiatives to modernize and integrate traditional medicine into the broader healthcare ecosystem. The cornerstone of these efforts is the Ayush Grid, which aims to create a unified digital health ecosystem, including the Ayush Health Management Information System (AHMIS) for citizen-centric electronic health records aligned with global standards. Under Ayush Grid, Ministry of Ayush has launched various

In 2018, Ministry of Ayush had launched the Ayush Grid as a digital health platform aligned with the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM). It integrates health services, education, research, schemes, training, citizen services, drug licensing, and media outreach across its Core, National, State, and Citizen Access layers. Significant achievements include the implementation of the ABHA-enabled Ayush Hospital Information Management System (AHMIS) in health services, Education Learning Management System (eLMS) Ayush Next Portal and AyuSoft. In the research domain, initiatives such as the NAMASTE portal, Ayush Research Portal, and ACCR Portal etc. have been established. Further, Y-Break App, the WHO m-Yoga App has also been developed.

Q) How is the quality and standardization of education and training in homeopathy being ensured?

A) Ministry of Ayush has established strict guidelines for homeopathic education through the National Commission for Homeopathy (NCH). National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH), a statutory body constituted under the provisions of the National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH) Act, 2020 recognises the Undergraduate and Postgraduate medical degree courses in Homoeopathy being awarded by the Universities in accordance with the National Commission for Homoeopathy (Recognition of Qualifications of Homoeopathy) Regulations, 2023. Periodic updating is done by implementing Competency Based Dynamic Curriculum. Efforts are also underway to enhance the quality of faculty through specialized training programs and workshops. The Ministry supports the accreditation of homeopathic colleges and ensures adherence to standards through regular inspections. Additionally, research-oriented education is being promoted to cultivate the next generation of skilled practitioners and researchers.

Q) What are the key areas of growth and challenges that the Homeopathy industry in India faces?

A) Growth areas include increasing domestic and international demand for homeopathic medicines and the integration of homeopathy into public health programs. However, challenges persist, such as the need for more need specific research to counter scepticism, regulatory hurdles in export markets,
